

PRE-REQUISITES

- Successful completion of Grade 10
- A recommended “C” or better in a Math 10 and an English Language Arts 10
- Student must be able to work independently, have good hand-eye coordination, good dexterity and be in good physical condition
- Good attendance and punctuality
- Between 15 and 19 years of age
- Registered and currently attending a public school in Surrey

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

- Have a discussion with your Career Facilitator, counsellor and parent/guardian to ensure the program meets your goals
- Obtain a district partnership application package from your Career Centre
- Arrange for a site visit through your Career Facilitator
- Submit a completed application package with all supporting documents to your Career Facilitator before the specified due date
- If short-listed, attend an interview with the District Career Coordinator
- Visit www.kpu.ca/trades to learn more about the Carpentry Program

SELECTION PROCESS

- Students who submit completed applications will have a preliminary interview with their school Career Facilitator
- Applications are forwarded to the district office for review
- Only short-listed candidates will be interviewed for a potential seat in the program
- Students must be on-track to meet the acceptance criteria for the post-secondary institute
- Students must be able to meet the physical demands of the program
- Students must meet all criteria, be self-motivated, independent learners and capable of success in the program

Are you interested in becoming a Carpenter?

JOB DESCRIPTION

Carpenters build and repair a vast array of structures made of wood, wood-substitutes and other materials. Many work for construction companies, contractors and maintenance departments while others are self-employed. Carpenter is a nationally designated trade under the Inter-provincial Red Seal program. Carpenters assemble and erect forms for concrete, wood and metal frame construction and use plans and instruments to prepare for excavating and shoring. On smaller projects, they direct concrete placement, and install exterior and interior finish materials such as siding, doors, windows and cabinets.



CONNECT TO POST SECONDARY

Through the Carpentry Program you have the potential to earn both high school and post-secondary credits.
