Dear Parents/Guardians,

We hope that you and your loved ones are safe and healthy during this time. We miss seeing your children at school and look forward to welcoming them back soon. As you are aware, while remote learning will continue for all students until June 25th, schools will also offer in-class learning beginning June 1st. During the month of June, in-class learning at school is optional. We support the decision of our families **and** will continue to offer learning experiences for our students whether at home or at school.

In order to assist us with our planning we respectfully request that all parents complete the following brief survey indicating their plans regarding their child's return to school. We recognize that families may still be considering their options and that plans may change over time. These survey results will simply guide us as we plan for our students on June 1st.

Tentative Schedule

We are working hard to prepare and organize classes for this new reopening for a smaller number of students. Upon receipt of the survey results, we will publish a final timetable for all students indicating when they will be attending school.

- K-5 students can expect to receive two days of in-class support a week.
- Student in grades 6-7 can expect to receive one day of in-class support a week.
- Students will be grouped by families into Group A or Group B.

Please note, those families choosing to continue with remote learning for the remainder of the school year will not receive a daily safe arrival call from our school office.

Expectations for Student and Staff Health

Our number one priority will be student and staff health & safety and well-being. All parents and caregivers will be asked to assess their children daily before sending them to school. Should any person experience symptoms of the common cold, influenza, COVID-19 or other infectious respiratory disease, entry will not be permitted into the school building or any district site.

- If a student experiences symptoms prior to attending school they must stay home until they have been assessed by a health care provider AND their symptoms have resolved.

- If a student experiences symptoms at school, they will be isolated with supervision and parents will be notified. Parents or caregivers will be expected to pick up their child as soon as possible.
- Parents and visitors to the school will not be permitted entry within the school building unless previously arranged with the school principal.
- If permitted inside the building, parents and visitors must abide by the hand washing and physical distancing requirements.

If your child returns to school, you can expect the following:

- Parents and caregivers remain outside the school building for pick-up and drop-off. Lunches must be sent to school with students in the morning.
- Access to the office is limited. Communication will occur primarily through phone or email.
- If possible, we will attempt to keep students with their regular classroom teacher and in their classroom learning space. Some changes may occur depending on the number of students returning to school.
- Spaced out seating and increased movement pathways within the classrooms.
- Frequent hand washing throughout the day, at every break (indoor and outdoor) and when students leave the room.
- A reduction of classroom 'clutter' on desks and shelves to assist with cleaning protocols.
- Children will be required to bring their own supplies to school and take them home each day.
- More time will be enjoyed outdoors. Please dress for the weather.
- Playgrounds will be opened for school use only.
- Students are asked to bring their own water bottle for use during the day.
- PPE is not recommended for school settings however some staff may choose to wear masks if working in small group situations.

This is not meant to be an exhaustive list and new protocols are currently being prepared regarding technology from home and device sharing. Any updates will be shared with families as soon as they are available.

We sincerely appreciate your support as transition into this next phase of schooling for our students. While we anticipate many questions, concerns and challenges will arise over the next few weeks, please know that we will endeavor to create the safest and most welcoming environment possible for our students.
