The month of November has been an active one at Earl Marriott Secondary. The highlight of this month was our **Remembrance Day Assemblies** on Nov. 9th. Our students presented a beautiful performance of reading, music and the traditional laying of the wreath. We would like to thank our own Earl Marriott Concert Band for their moving performance during the Assembly, our student hosts and presenters, as well as all the teachers and students who helped with technical support and organization.

On Nov. 16th, our school had the honour of hosting the Holocaust Symposium, with support from the Vancouver Holocaust Education Center. We welcomed guest speakers and Holocaust survivors, Mariette Doduck and Alex Buckman. Guest lecturer Sebastian Huebel began the program with his presentation entitled "Trying to Comprehend the Incomprehensible". This was a fantastic opportunity for our students and our thanks goes to the Vancouver Holocaust Education Center for their support, and the organization of our own Mr. Figueira in bringing this opportunity to Earl Marriott.

Our Grade 8 and 9 students were invited to attend the Justice Theatre presentations earlier this month. The focus of the interactive presentation was Social Media and Bulling. Students also learned a lot of interesting information about our justice system, and how things work in a court of law.

Earlier this month, our Grade 9 students participated in **Take Your Kid to Work Day**. Our Career department works successfully to ensure that all students at Earl Marriott participate. Thank you to Ms. Garrett and Ms. Brabenec for all of the work they also do for our Grade 12's hosting lunch time University visits and publishing information through @emsscholarships.

I'd like to take this opportunity to thank all of our Fall coaches and players. Earl Marriott had a great season with volleyball, swimming, football and cross country. The banners for our school are filling the office, with hopefully more to come. The teams were celebrated for their achievements at a Pep rally on Nov. 21st. Thanks to our Student Council for their work in building school spirit and community. Of special note this month is our volleyball teams moving forward to the Provincials at the end of the month. Parents and students can get all of the team news through the Mari-time App. Come out and support the Mariners as they play for the school at the Provincials in the last two weeks of November.

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This month you will be receiving the first formal report of the school year. **Report Cards will be published through the MyEd parent Portal on Nov. 22nd.** Grade 8 and 9 students will be receiving letter grades only on their reports, in line with the new assessment practices and reporting order. Please take this time to review the report card with your son or daughter, and create a plan for the remaining final weeks of the semester, which ends on **Wednesday, January 24th.** Students who have outstanding work or need extra support time to complete courses will be asked to come to Completion Days on Thursday January 25th and Friday January 26th. If there are concerns or questions about your child's progress, please contact teachers directly by email or by leaving a message at the school.

On Friday Nov. 3rd, our teaching staff participated in a full day of conversation and activities focused on **curriculum planning and implementation.** The curriculum is now fully implemented at Grade 8 and 9, will begin implementation for Grade 10 next year, and have full implementation for all grades by Sept. 2019. It was a wonderful opportunity to have time to focus on the changes, and collaborate with each other and teachers from around the District. Some of the highlights of the new curriculum include **a focus on core competencies of critical and creative thinking, communication and personal and social responsibility.** Core competencies are sets of intellectual, personal, and social/emotional proficiencies that all students need to develop in order to engage in deeper learning.

Already we have begun planning for December events and Earl Marriott traditions. For this year's Grads, the Dry Grad Parent Committee and Grad Council are hosting our Annual Grad Fashion Show on Nov. 23rd, followed by the Grad Cruise on Nov. 28th. The calendar is full with our Christmas Music Concerts, EMS Talent Show, One Act plays, the Pancake Breakfast and the Annual Winter Hoedown. **The last day of classes before Christmas Break will be Friday Dec. 22nd.** Our Bell Schedule will be different that day to accommodate the Pancake Breakfast and Lunchtime Hoedown. Bussing students will be picked up as per usual, but the early dismissal schedule will be used for the trip home. Please check the Dec./Jan. calendar carefully as the end of semester will be fast approaching once we return from Christmas Break.
