Principal's Message:

On behalf of the entire staff of Earl Marriott Secondary, I am delighted to welcome everyone back to school. I hope that you all enjoyed a safe and relaxing summer, and that you are looking forward to a year of new learning and experiences.

School will be starting on **Tuesday September 7**th with homeroom (Block C) for students in **Grades 9 - 12** at 10:00 am. You should plan to be at school for about a half hour on Tuesday.

Students in **Grade 8** will meet on the Main Field at **10:30** am, directly north of the parking lot, to find their **Semester One**, **C block** teacher and class. Grade 8 students will then have a tour of the school, a run through of all their classes, check out their lockers, and end the morning with a Grade 8 celebration. Grade 8 students should plan to be at school until 1:30 pm.

On **Wednesday September 8th**, we will begin classes for Semester One at our regular start time of 8:35 am. Please check the website daily for up to date information on school opening, and any changes that may happen due to Provincial Health Orders. **At this time, there is a Provincial Health Order for Mandatory Masks for all staff, students and visitors to the school.**

STUDENT TIMETABLES - Coming soon!1

All returning students will receive a message from the school when families will be able to access their 2021-2022 timetable on the MyEd BC portal. Once in the portal, click on the top tab>Family > left side tab> Schedule. When the schedule appears, click in the "schedule" heading and then the "term" heading to view your schedule in the correct block order.

Parents will log-on with their email and students will log-on with their student number.

Grade 8 students and new incoming students will have their timetables mailed to their home address.

SCHOOL FEE COLLECTION

This year, we will be collecting our student fees using the school district's secure online fee payment system. We encourage families to log on to our system early.

STUDENT DEBTS

Students will be assessed a cost for lost or damaged school property (books, lockers, sport jerseys, etc.) Charges are based on the replacement cost of the item. Students must return the same textbook to receive credit, so avoid lending textbooks and label your text with your full name and student number.



ABSENCES AND LATES

Students are expected to be at school and in class on time. It is the student's responsibility to be punctual for all classes.

- · ABSENT *or* LATE Parents are asked to phone the school in the morning.
- . Students showing any symptoms of illness must stay home.

VACATIONS DURING SCHOOL TIME

Students away on extended vacations (4 or more days) during school time must complete an extended absence form, available in the office, before departure. The school is not in a position to grant permission to any students to miss school for an extended holiday period, and it is important to be aware of the possible effects on achievement. Further, it is not required that teachers provide work for students on vacation.

IMPORTANT NOTICE RE: MEDICAL ALERTS



A Medical Alert condition is defined as a physician diagnosed, potentially life threatening condition such as:

Diabetes Epilepsy

Severe asthma Serious Heart Conditions

Blood clotting disorders Anaphylaxis (history of severe allergic response)

Parents are responsible to update the school with any medical issues. In emergency situations, a parent/guardian (or the emergency contact) shall be contacted and the student taken to a hospital. As per District policy, we are unable to provide students with any over-the-counter medication (eg. Tylenol, Advil).



STUDENT PARKING

As there is limited student parking at EMS, student parking is only available to grade 12 students and is on a first-come first-served basis in the designated student rows only. Students parking in Visitor or Staff Stalls (including near or around the portables) or parked illegally (including in the laneway behind the gym), may result in the student's car being towed at the owners' expense (minimum charge \$185.00). Parking at school is a privilege. Unsafe driving practices will result in this privilege being revoked. Grade 12 students with a valid drivers license and their "N" will be able to register via the student sign up system on September 23rd to obtain a parking decal.

PARENT PARKING

Please be sure to park in the marked Visitor spaces only when you visit the school and then report to the office.

LOCKER DISTRIBUTION

Our online locker distribution process will begin for Grade 12 students on August 30th at 10:00 am. Grade 11's will begin August 31st, Grade 10's on September 1st, Grade 9's on September 2nd.

Grade 8 students will sign up on September 3rd. Students will require their student numbers which will be arriving in the mail with their schedules sometime next week.

The mission of FIRST is to inspire young people to be science and technology leaders and innovators, by engaging them in exciting mentor-based programs that build science, engineering, and technology skills, that inspire innovation, and that foster well-rounded life capabilities including self-confidence, communication, and leadership.

Mentors and Coaches are individuals from all backgrounds and disciplines who work with students to share their knowledge and guide them through the season. Many Mentors contribute on a weekly basis during competition season, or support the team with subject matter expertise on an as needed basis. Teams may have additional or more specialized roles or a combination of roles as needed. In addition, Mentors help to foster the idea of Gracious Professionalism® and have the students do as much of the work as possible.

As a Mentor or Coach of the Tech-Mates *FIRST* Robotics Competition team, you are, through the kids, the key ingredient in the success of our team. The time, responsibility and expertise of a Mentor or Coach will vary but the one constant is that you are bringing something to your team that they need to learn, grow and succeed. *FIRST* is more than just robots,

Is any adult, teaching others what they know

Brings either technical or non technical expertise to the team

Provides the opportunity for students to learn directly through experiences

Sample Mentor/Coach Roles

NON-TECHNICAL:

Project Management Mentor

- Provides an overview of project management concepts for team
- Guides the team throughout the project life cycle

Scholarship Mentor

- Assist to educate students, Mentors and parents regarding scholarship opportunities available to FIRST students
- Coordinates applications for student/ Mentor nominations for awards

Marketing Mentor

- Provides a basic overview of Marketing concepts
- Assists students with development and implementation of a Marketing Plan in coordination with the development of a Business Plan

Finance Mentor

- Assist the team in preparing a Business Plan, financial planning/budget for the season
- Organize and assists with fundraising efforts

TECHNICAL:

Robot Programming/Software Engineering Mentor

- Assist team members with writing code to control robot in C++, Java, Robot C or LabVIEW (depending on program)
- Maintains process focus

Electrical Engineer Mentor

- Assist team with wiring the robot's power and signal system
- Assist and instruct the team members in the electrical and electronics systems on the robot

Mechanical Engineer Mentor

- Provides assistance with design and construction of the robot
- Advise students on the safe use of tools and safety procedures
