What Do I Need to Graduate?

- ▶ Numeracy Assessment
- ▶ 80 general credits (from Grades Ten through Twelve)
(Most courses are 4 credits, so that is 20 courses)
- ▶ Four Grade 12 courses
 - One Fine Arts or Applied Skills
 - English 10, 11, and 12
 - Socials 10 and Socials 12 (all senior socials are Grade 12)
 - Math 10 and 11
 - Science 10 and 11
 - Physical Education 10
 - Career Life Education (CLE) 10 and CLC (2 credits) and Capstone (2 credits)

Sending Out Your Transcripts Online:

- Set up an account

- Provide them access to your transcript

Applying for Post Secondary



- High School Graduation.
- Six Academic/Non-academic courses recommended, but not required.
- Admission based on all Grade 11 /12 marks and program dependent.
- Considered for Entrance Scholarships: due December 1, 2019.
- Personal Profile required for application to all programs.
- Regular applications January 15, 2020.
- Online courses completed by February 1, 2020.

Applying for Post Secondary



- Each student self-reports their own marks via the student portal.
- Students Entrance Scholarships due December 15, 2019.
- No Personal Profile required, except for Beedie.
- Applications due by January 31 2020.
- Admission based on a minimum of 5 Grade 12 courses – program dependent.
- Online courses completed by January 31, 2020.
- Students must accept early admission offers by May 1st.

Applying for Post Secondary



- High school graduation.
- English 12 (C+)
- Some programs will require prerequisite courses, otherwise, upgrading or supplementary courses are offered at KPU.
- Applications open October 1, 2019.
- Offers begin mid-January 2020.
- Early Application Deadline, March 1, 2020.
- Access to registration in a priority fashion based on application date. So, apply early!

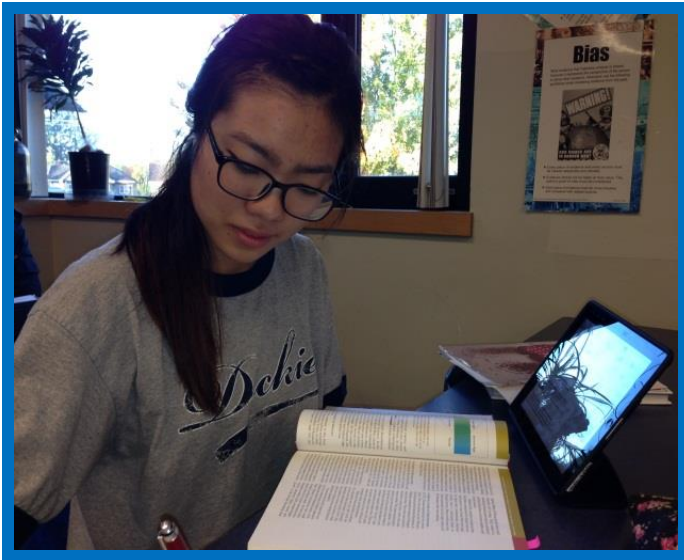

Reference Letters



- **Help your references help you! How?**
 - Select someone who knows you well:
 - Length of time (longer is better)
 - Different contexts (*e.g.*, teacher, coach, employer, religious leader)
 - Someone who can speak to your character.
 - Provide the recommender at least 2–3 weeks' notice.
- **Help! No one knows me really well! What do I do?**
 - Offer them a "Facts Sheet" or FHS Student Profile

 - Read. Fill out. Print off. Give to your referee. Be happy.
