## PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

I hope this newsletter finds everyone rested and refreshed after the summer break. I also hope that everyone had a good summer, filled with some combination of relaxation, travel, vacation and/or further study. I hope that you, like our students, are getting excited about a new year of learning, and all the opportunities and challenges that this brings. We are very much looking forward to beginning the 2019-2020 school year.

We expect to open this year with about 1380 students. This is a little above our projection, so we will monitor our numbers carefully and seek additional staffing, as needed. Going into the summer we had roughly five jobs to fill. At this time we welcome the following teachers back or to Fraser Heights Secondary:

In addition to the addition

- Ms. N. Nickel will be off on a medical leave for much of semester 1, we are working on a long term TOC replacement
- Mr. P. Scarlett will begin a gradual return to work, following a medical leave. We will have someone in replacing Mr. Scarlett to allow him to return part time and see how that goes
- We will hire an Information Technology/Math teacher and may have one or two emerging staffing situations that we will respond to.
- We will also have a number of new Education Assistants beginning with us.

For students, as with every year, it is important to get off to a good start. We continue to shift towards a Learning by Design/ Know-Do-Understand curricular framework activated through continual examination of curricular and core competencies. Within this instructional approach, learning is framed around big questions that each student will seek individual answer(s) to and build skills in defending their positions, both in verbal and written formats.

More generally, within the new instructional approach, there are key skills to master and learning strategies to implement. Inquiry and project based learning are two of the main instructional strategies we use. At the heart of our school district is a district-wide shared vision for learning. Here we prepare our learners for a world in which they think creatively and critically, communicate skillfully, and demonstrate care for self and other. To get off to the best start and make sure that our students are successful this upcoming year, there are 'universal truths' to be aware of.

The first is to realize that success in school, like success in life, **requires organization, hard work, commitment and persistence**. No matter what anyone says, there are no easy paths or shortcuts to success in learning. Instead, to maximize your potential and success, you need to focus during instruction, use your class and flex time effectively and you should do thirty to sixty minutes of homework/homestudy prior to each school day. Brain research reinforces this perspective and shows that a key factor in long term deep learning happens through continued low level stimulation of your brain. Cramming prior to a test can get you through, but if you really want to learn, remember and understand something, then you should consistently and systematically work at it. There are a number of great study tools/ideas out there to help you with all of this.

Two of the simplest and most useful study techniques that I know are **Question and Answer Cards**, and **Cornel Notes**. Q & A cards are simply 'index' style cards that you write questions or terms on one side, then answers/definitions on the other. Then, you keep flipping through these until you know them consistently. Another great study technique is Cornell Notes. This is a system of notetaking where learners take all the pages in their notebook and draw a vertical line down each page, about three quarters of the way across. Then students do all your classwork on the left three quarters of the page and use the remaining space to the right of the line to write down key words or questions. When you go to study, you simply cover the main notes part and answer the key questions, or define the words. Many of you will know and use other techniques that work for you, these are just two that I have found to be simple and beneficial.

A copy of your son/daughter's tentative academic timetable is available on the portal. Students have had opportunities to 'fine tune' this schedule. Our timetable 'came together' later than usual this year and our courses are very full, so there is very limited room to make changes. We also still anticipate enrolling more students, potentially opening more blocks, and hiring one or more new teachers. This will result in further timetable changes. Our first priority in September is servicing new registrations and those students who do not have complete schedules, or who have taken a summer school class and need to change a class on their timetable to reflect this. Then we will start balancing classes. Counsellors will be in the last week of August, roughly the 26<sup>th</sup> through August 30<sup>th</sup> and students access counsellors by grade and by day. Please see the information on accessing school counsellors further within this newsletter.

We continue to use the **Firehawk App** as our digital school agenda. The app is from Appazur and everyone (students and parents) are able to download it for free on the App Store or the Google Play store. (just search for Firehawk) We continually push messages out through this app, it is district supported, and we hope to scaffold its functionality through the school. We

also provide regular paper school agendas to junior students who request them. In time, we hope to eliminate these agendas through everyone using the App, but we are not there yet.

I always encourage all students to make the most of what the school offers by intentionally choosing to get involved in at least one outside of class activity. We host a large number of clubs, a comprehensive athletics program and a student run school governance structure. We also encourage our parents to stay involved and be aware of what is happening at school. We have monthly PAC meetings, they are crisp and keep to an hour long framework. Our first PAC meeting is Tuesday, September 17<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 in the school's Learning Commons (library). Our PAC meetings run from 7:00 to 8:00.


Two more notes. First, we continue a shift in our instructional focus towards a competency based curriculum built around a Learning by Design/Know-Do-Understand approach to learning. Our focus is on skill development with a continued, but lesser emphasis on content acquisition. Inquiry, Project Based Learning and ongoing metacognition (reflecting or thinking about learning) are key tools we use in instruction. Not much of this should be new to our parents, as the whole kindergarten through graduation program system is experiencing this shift.

Second and equally important. We focus first on safety, once safety is established we shift to learning. We believe we have a very safe school, where the focus is on learning and further developing student core competencies in thinking, communicating and being personally and socially responsible. However, we experienced a critical incident in early June that was very disturbing. Essentially, a group of students chose to deal themselves with a situation that they falsely believed another student was involved in. Their actions were reprehensible; they resulted in School District and RCMP involvement and action and deep reflection within our school. One outcome of this reflection reinforced the importance of relationships and communication between everyone at school. These will be points of emphasis as we start the school year.

My belief is that it is critical that students are comfortable and it is part of the culture of the school for students to consult with parents and school personnel if/when things are happening at school that make them uncomfortable. It is only through dialogue, and dealing with 'issues' when they are relatively small that we can create the school we all want. While I know that such desired communication can be difficult, it is important to also know that the Surrey School District's Safe Schools Department has an anonymous tip line call PSST (Protecting Surrey Students Together). It is available at <https://www.psst-bc.ca/>, and is a great tool, if students don't feel that direct communication with school personnel is possible.

Again, how we communicate and treat each other will be points of emphasis throughout the 2019-2020 school year. Parents play a key role in this process. If you notice or are wondering about something, please do not hesitate to call the school (604-582-9231) and please ask to speak to a counsellor or administrator.

## **ATTENDANCE**

Regular attendance is a major factor contributing to student success in school. We expect that students enrolled at Fraser Heights Secondary will attend school regularly and arrive to class on time. If a student is absent, parents are requested to phone or email the school on the morning of the absence. If this is not possible, please send a note with your child to turn into the office on the day they return to school.

## **BUS PASSES**

All students wishing to ride the school bus must apply for a School Bus Pass. This application needs to be completed each year. If your son/daughter has not applied for his/her bus pass, please have them go to the school office to pick up an application form.

## **NO HAT POLICY**

This is a reminder that Fraser Heights has a no hat policy. This includes baseball caps, toques, bandanas, and headbands. This is primarily for safety reasons as it allows our school staff to identify people who shouldn't be in our building much more effectively.



## LEAVING SCHOOL EARLY

In some cases, it may be necessary for students to leave school before the end of the school day. Students wishing to leave the school early must come to the office and sign out. In order to sign out, students must have written permission from their parent/guardian. In cases where written permission is not provided, the office staff will contact parents or guardians for verification.

## PARKING

There are a very limited number of parking spaces for students on school property. Students wishing to have the privilege of parking their car on school property must register their vehicle at the office. There is no charge for student parking, however, parking spots are available each morning on a first come, first served basis. Please Note: Students must park in marked parking stalls. If our parking lot is full, we are allowed to park in the Surrey Parks & Recreation parking lot along 160<sup>th</sup> Street.

## PERSONAL PROPERTY

## SNOW DAYS

## LOCKERS

Students this year will be able to choose their own locker on-line. Please see the attached information sheet on how to access this on-line system. They should also access this website if they forget their locker combination. Students do not need to buy a lock or bring their own lock from home. Lockers will have locks on them. Only school locks may be used on lockers. At the end of the school year, students must turn in their locks to their homeroom teachers or they will be charged a \$7.00 lock replacement fee. School lockers are the property of the school and may be searched by school officials at any time without prior notice. Students do not have to use a school locker.
