

You can adjust the search on the right hand side. Try adjusting:

- the level of **Education**, such as Certificate/Diploma (1-3 years of study), or
- the **Industry**, such as focusing on only “Finance, Insurance & Real Estate” as well as “Public Administration” to narrow your search results
- You can also adjust the **salary** range, to find careers that pay better, or that require less or more schooling. Generally, the higher the salary, the more degrees completed at post-secondary. However, you can select the education level you are willing and able to tackle, and add a preferred salary range to see your options.
