ONLINE PAYMENTS

We are hoping that parents/guardians will use our online payment method to pay for planners, field studies and other special events. This helps reduce paper usage, reduces clerical time spent sorting, counting and depositing bills/coins and provides a safe-secure way to pay for a variety of school related items.

It is very similar to paying for hot lunch online. Once a family sets up their account for one or more children (one account per family), it is there for the whole time the child(ren) attend(s) school at Laronde. We thank you in advance if you have already registered and encourage all families to do so.

PLANNERS

We encourage all students in Grades 2 -7 to purchase a School Planner at a cost of \$5.00. *We will be opening up our online payment system, Friday, September 14 after 2 pm, in order for you to easily pay for the planners.* Included in the planner is our school code of conduct, school calendar and school district information. We find this to be an excellent tool for facilitating home/school communication, as well as for developing our students' organizational skills. However, using our school planner is optional as a parent may purchase their own version.

COLOURED SHIRTS

ORANGE SHIRT DAY

Orange Shirt Day is a legacy of the St. Joseph Mission (SJM) residential school commemoration event held in Williams Lake, BC, Canada, in the spring of 2013. It grew out of *Phyllis' story* of having her shiny new orange shirt taken away on her first day of school at the Mission, and it has become an opportunity to keep the discussion on all aspects of residential schools happening annually.

The date was chosen because it is the time of year in which children were taken from their homes to residential schools, and because it is an opportunity to set the stage for anti-racism and anti-bullying policies for the coming school year. It also gives teachers time to plan events that will include children, as we want to ensure that we are passing the story and learning on to the next generations.

Orange Shirt Day is also an opportunity for First Nations, local governments, schools and communities to come together in the spirit of reconciliation and hope for generations of children to come.

LICE CHECK

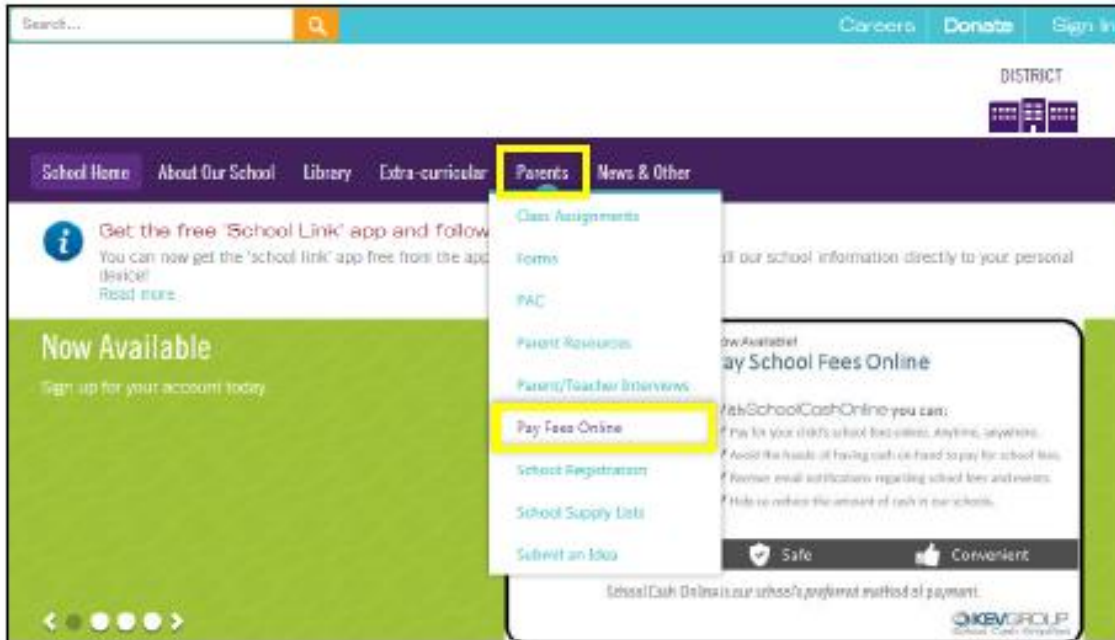
A friendly reminder to check your child's hair regularly for lice, to help prevent any outbreaks.

How to register for online payments

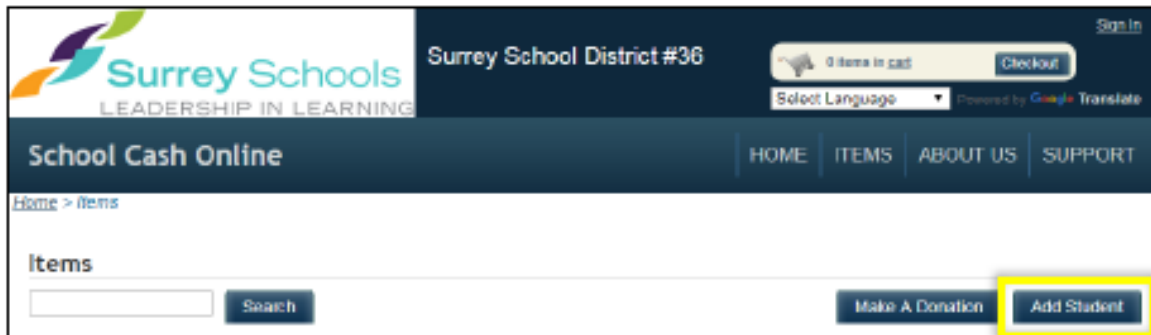
1. Visit the school website at:

2. Hover the mouse over the "Parents" tab and click "Pay Fees Online"



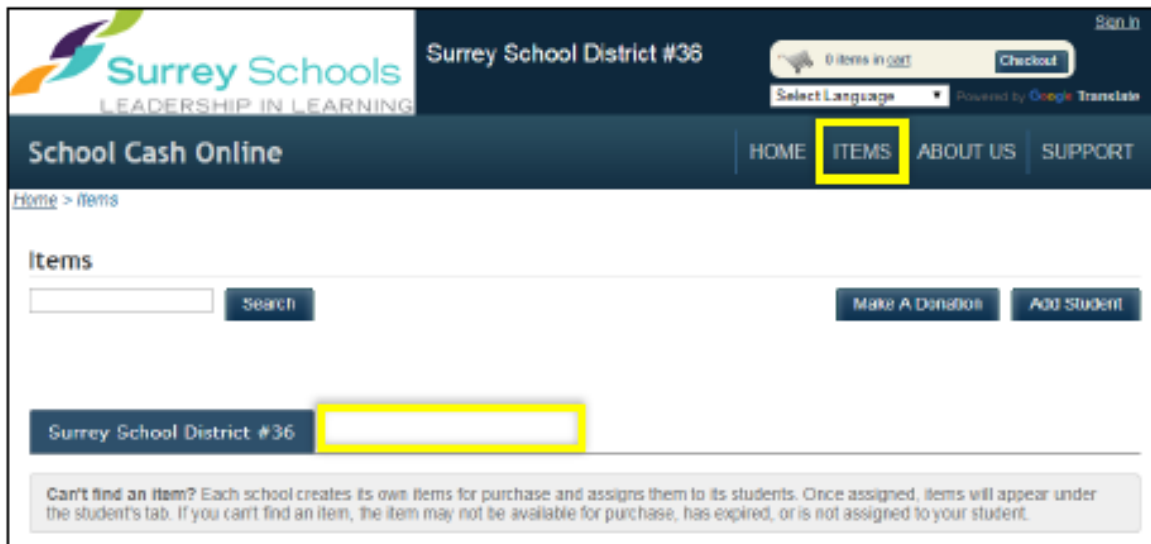
3. Click "Get Started Today" and follow the prompts to set up your account.



- Once you have created an account and received the email confirmation, log in to your account. Click "Add Student" and follow the prompts to attach your child. Be sure to attach your child to your account to receive notifications of fees posted online.



- After you have added your child, click on the "Items" tab (top right menu). You will see your child's name as a new tab beside the Surrey School District #36 tab.



- Click on your child's tab to see any fees to be paid. Select the item you wish to pay for and follow the prompts for payment. You will be able to deposit funds into your account (MyWallet) or pay directly from your chequing account (e-Check).
